Key Facts

David Hockney is an English painter, draftsman, printmaker, stage designer, and photographer. He was born in 1937 in Bradford where he went to Bradford Art College before he went to the Royal College of Art in London.

Hockney's work *Portrait of an Artist (Pool with Two Figures)* sold for £70 million.

All colours can be created from mixing the 3 primary colours of red, yellow and blue.

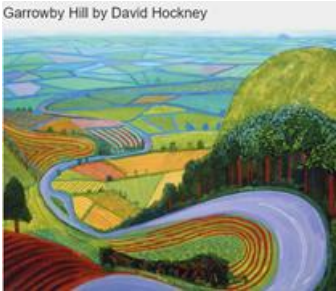

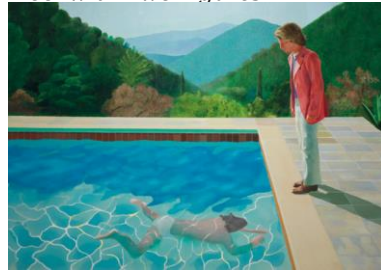
